### SNACK IDEAS:

### "Painted" Paw Print Cupcakes

Even on the day of her own party, Bad Kitty just can't seem to stay out of trouble ... or out of wet paint! Luckily, her colorful paw prints make a snazzy topper for these scrumptious cupcakes. Follow this recipe, and your guests will be complimenting Kitty's delicious mess! (Makes approximately 2 dozen regular cupcakes)

### **Ingredients:**

#### For the cake:

2 sticks butter 3 cups all-purpose flour 1 tbsp. baking powder  $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. salt 1½ cups sugar 4 large eggs, room temperature 1 tbsp. vanilla extract

For the frosting:

1 cup milk

1 cup butter 1 tsp. vanilla extract 6 cups confectioner's sugar 24 round chocolate-peanut candies 96 round chocolate candies

### "Milk Bowl" Ice Cream

For a fun and delicious treat to pair with your kitty cupcakes, encourage guests to try lapping up "milk" (ice cream) from a bowl-just like a cat! Use any kind of ice cream you like, but remember—no hands!

#### Instructions:



• Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

• Line cupcake pans with standard liners.

• Combine dry ingredients in a large bowl.

 Lightly whisk eggs in a medium bowl. Add remaining ingredients and stir together until blended.

 Add wet ingredients to dry ingredients, mixing well until completely combined.

Pour into liners until each one is 2/3 full.

 Bake for about 30 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean when inserted.

• Let cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan; cool completely on a wire rack.

### For the frosting and paw prints:

Beat butter and vanilla together.

 Fold in confectioner's sugar in batches, scraping down the sides of the bowl between each batch.

Frost generously!

 Place one chocolate-peanut candy in the center of each frosted cupcake.

 Line the top half of each cupcake with 4 chocolate candies to form a paw print.

### DECORATION AND CRAFT IDEAS:

### Cat Ear Headbands

Print out the below cat ear template and cut out the pieces. Line up the template on a sturdy piece of felt and cut out two of each piece from the felt. Center the smaller piece of felt in the middle of the larger piece and secure with fabric alue. Carefully using a hot glue gun, secure the ears to the top of an inexpensive black headband for a quick and easy cat costume!

### **Guessing Game**

Fill a fish bowl with goldfish crackers and encourage quests to guess how many fish are in the bowl by writing their votes with their name on a small piece of paper and placing in a second fish bowl beside it. The guest who has avessed closest to the actual number of fish in the bowl (without going over) is the winner!

### **Bad Kitty Mask**

For more fun with Bad Kitty, copy the mask template on the next page and encourage your guests to color it in and cut it out (with a parent's help!). Make a hole with scissors of a paper punch on each side of the mask on the designated point near the edge. Cut a length of elastic cording or yarn to fit around your head, leaving a few extra inches. Thread the cording through each hole, and tie off on each side.

### Have a Ball with Balls of Yarn!







For even more fun with yarn, use the string for a game of Cat's Cradle!







