

Good morning, Kitty!


I have a very special breakfast for you today!



But . . . uh . . . there is one teeny, tiny, little thing you have to do today, Kitty. Try to stay calm, okay? We have an appointment for you to get a . . .










KITTY!

Why so dramatic? Do you know what a shot is? It's a vaccine. Vaccines are good! Vaccines are medicine that will keep you from getting sick someday.




You don't want to get sick, do you?

I'm talking about becoming so sick that you might even have to go to the HOSPITAL! But a vaccine can prevent that.



Okay?




Great! Thank you for being so brave, Kitty.
